






Our Vision

Little Zebra Books exists to help African children grow in their love for reading and love for the Lord.





Molweni! Being part of Little Zebra Books is something close to my heart. Having grown up in the township and not being a reader, I was encouraged to read with my kids. This was one of the best decisions of my life. What I love about Little Zebra Books is that they have books in the kids' home language and relatable images, where each child feels that they can identify with the pictures. I would like to see reading spread to all communities, especially in the Township and Rural areas. Little Zebra Books gives parents and children access to simple books.

In 2022, the governing board of Little Zebra Books prioritized putting in place structures and practices that would increase the sustainability of our organization. To do that, we partnered with Luceo Solutions to take an in-depth look at everything we do. As part of that process, the governing board working together with staff and beneficiaries came up with a new vision statement. We also began the process of hiring local South African staff. We hired a full-time office manager and began the process of identifying key roles that must be filled in the near future, including an operations and production manager, a fundraiser, and eventually a South African Director. This will help us to remain contextual and to access local funding.

My prayer is that Little Zebra Books will continue to spread across the continent of Africa until all children can grow up with beautiful books in their own languages.



When COVID-19 hit, Little Zebra Books got busy! We doubled down on sharing our books online. As a result all our books were shared on the African Storybook website in multiple languages. And in order to address the emotional and spiritual impact of the pandemic, we partnered with Beautiful Gate to produce four original book titles just for children living in the uncertain times of pandemic.

Fast-forward to 2022 and it was the year we got to get back to work! In 2021 we had printed only 45 books! In 2022, we printed an amazing 166,739 beautiful books for children and most of those were immediately out the door heading for Mozambique and many locations in South Africa.

One of our most significant achievements in 2022 was adding our books to the Bloom Library. This online site is making our beautiful books accessible to language communities across Africa and around the world. It has been a team effort to get books laid out for multiple formats. We are getting wonderful feedback from people around the world who are loving the beautiful books we have created.



OUR INNOVATIVE BOOKS

All of our Easy Readers, Folktales, and Bible Books are produced in two different formats:


small folding books and large bilingual books.



Every Little Zebra Book is produced in a **small folding book layout**. This format is specifically designed to be a cost-effective way of printing thousands of books to distribute to individual children so that each child receives their own copy to take home. The folding books are monolingual, containing only the children's first language.



Secondly, every Little Zebra Book is produced in a **large, square, bilingual layout**. This format is specifically designed to be used by the adults, teachers, and Sunday school teachers who use our books with children. The 21x21cm size makes it easy to show the pictures to a group of children.



MOZAMBIQUE: PARTNERS

In 2022 our field partners in Mozambique moved out of the pandemic and into fully thriving reading clubs and Sunday School programs! Our key volunteer coordinators in central Mozambique have taken hold of the real responsibility of planning and implementing good quality programs. Their initiative and growing independence makes us very proud!

One of our goals is to see local partners using Little Zebra Books as an inspiration and tool to help children grow in their love for reading and their love for the Lord.

- We celebrated five years of service for four of the Tete Community volunteers. They now mentor new recruits, adding skills and independence to the team.
- James Joanete leads the drive to train local language Sunday School teachers across the Nyungwe and Nyanja speaking districts of Mozambique through his leadership of Children's Hope in Christ.
- Our partners at Prodelise in Beira, have now nominated a volunteer coordinator for Sena groups. This is proving to be an effective way to reach the ten re-established clubs after the cyclone in 2018.






Xhosa Christmas

At the end of 2022 we launched a project called 'Xhosa Christmas', the aim of this project was to send South African beneficiaries books that would benefit the community over the Christmas period.

During this time we packed books into gift boxes and distributed 4780 books to 16 beneficiary organisations. These groups are predominantly in the Western Cape Region of South Africa.





NPO Accelerator Course

Future Fund


Another board initiative launched in 2022 was the Little Zebra Books Future Fund. The purpose of the Future Fund is to invest in the long-term sustainability of the organization through a growing endowment fund. A portion of the fund may be designated for projects, provided that they are contributing to our organisation's long-term sustainability. It is hoped that in time interest income from this fund may be used to fund production of books in languages across Africa.



Little Zebra Books is growing year by year. This can easily be seen by the total costs growing from R373,000 to over R1,000,000 in 2022. A large portion of this was printing costs (almost R270,000 more than 2021), which means that Little Zebra Books was able to reach a lot more children in 2022.

The downside is that the deficit is growing each year. In 2021, each Rand earned cost R1.02. In 2022, each rand earned cost R1.07. This means that we need to start attracting more Grants, Donations, and Sales. Thanks to the Luceo NPO Accelerator Course, we have started to put building blocks in place to ensure that the organisation can continue to grow and be financially sustainable.


This includes key personnel, which will see the operational costs rise significantly. This is vital for the longevity of Little Zebra Books and the continued distribution of books to children in Southern Africa.

Little Zebra Books will be trialing a grant writer to approach various institutions and governments in order to secure funding in 2023. We are also looking at various partnerships in which we can generate income by creating and selling books that align with our vision to these partners.

Currently, our liquidity is nowhere close to what it should be. As any Christian organisation should be doing, we have been trusting in God's grace to provide for our continued existence and He has always provided. The hope is that the new fundraiser will be able to raise the necessary funds to ensure that Little Zebra Books can continue its growth.

I would personally like to thank everyone that has donated and continues to donate to Little Zebra Books so that Little Zebra Books can continue to provide mother-tongue books and the message of Jesus to children across Southern Africa. It is truly a blessing to see the joy on the faces of these children when they receive their very own books.





