2024 has been a positive and encouraging year for LZB, leaving us in a strong position from which to launch a new strategic plan, focused on growth and sustainability.

MASIFUNDE SIDLALA

After evaluation of our pilot project, we officially launched our **Masifunde Sidlala** programme in July 2024. We onboarded eight partner organizations with a reach of over 2,700 children in isiXhosaspeaking communities. Partners selected ten book titles for translation into isiXhosa, with 4000 small books and 40 large books printed per title. The small books were given to children to take home to build their own home library, and the large books were used by practitioners in their reading programmes.

We also held monthly Community of Practice meetings, where partners shared feedback and learned new skills, including translation practices and reading activities. Site visits were conducted regularly to observe reading activities, offer support, and address challenges.



The response to Masifunde Sidlala has been overwhelmingly positive, with partners reporting significant improvements in children's reading skills and confidence. Many children developed a love for reading and requested more books. Partners also valued the Community of Practice as a space to share ideas and learn from one another.

We have also helped partners understand the importance of learning to read in mother tongue. Partners have reported how this has led to increased confidence and improved reading skills in children.

Following such positive feedback, we are excited to continue expanding the programme and inspiring young children on their reading journeys.






THE IMPACT OF OUR BOOKS

As part of our support to partners, Ntsikie Sicgu, our community facilitator, regularly visited our programme partners, observing reading activities and engaging with the children.

During one such visit, she encountered Amahle*, a Grade 2 learner who joined the programme to improve her reading skills. Amahle proudly told Ntsikie how much loved the book *Usapho luka Thembi* (Thembi's Family) and that she carried it with her everywhere she went. When Ntsikie asked her why she kept it with her, Amahle responded, "This is how I can show everyone who is in my family."

For Amahle, this book was more than just a tool for learning to read—it was a source of pride. She was excited to share her family story with others, showcasing how the programme has not only improved her reading skills but also helped her connect with her identity in a meaningful way.



OUR IMPACT - ECD

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iThemba School in Fish Hoek, one of the few Early Childhood Development (ECD) centres to join Masifunde Sidlala, has embraced the challenge of ensuring that parents actively read with their children. To foster this, the school created a special WhatsApp group for the parents of all 60 learners. After the children have story time at school, the books are sent home, where parents are encouraged to read with their children and engage in related activities. All updates, instructions, and activities are shared via the WhatsApp group, keeping parents involved and informed.

The response has been overwhelmingly positive, with parents eagerly anticipating each new book every month. This initiative has not only helped improve reading at home but has also strengthened the connection between the school and parents, creating a supportive community focused on the children's literacy development.



LITASA CONFERENCE 2024

Little Zebra Books sent 5 representatives to the 2024 Literacy Association of South Africa Conference held at UCT in Cape Town from 13-15 September. The LITASA Conference once again offered exciting input on current research and thinking in the South African education and literacy space. We were particularly drawn to the presentations concerning multilingual Education and new research showing the importance of mother tongue in child's learning.

Little Zebra Books had an opportunity to present on the success of the Masifunde Sidlala Pilot Project, which was well received. Our emphasis on the benefits of reading in a child's home language were supported by the positive results of our pilot. We are proud to report that our presentation was specifically named as one of the most appreciated of the conference!



SIL - PARTNERSHIP

As a global faith-based nonprofit, SIL is committed to empowering communities through language development, grounded in the belief that all people are created by God and given language as a means to flourish. In this mission, Little Zebra Books has been a vital partner, offering high-quality, accessible content through the SIL Bloom Library platform.

The Bloom Library features the "Little Zebra Bookshelf," a curated collection of engaging, easy-to-translate titles. These resources make it possible for local communities to access and produce meaningful content in their own languages.

In March 2024, SIL conducted a training workshop in Angola, equipping local writers to develop early literacy materials in seven national languages. Using selected Little Zebra titles, they created foundational word books and new derivative stories based on existing illustrations. The project resulted in 13 new books, now part of the Angolan language children's library.

In Tanzania, our team adapted Little Zebra Books to develop a Sunday School curriculum, integrating biblical stories with themes such as God's love, prayer, and Christian living. These lessons help children engage with the gospel in a culturally relevant and accessible way. Little Zebra Books continues to demonstrate innovation and faithfulness in providing content well-suited to African contexts. Their partnership has strengthened our efforts to promote literacy, support spiritual growth, and make local language resources widely available.

We are grateful for their collaboration and look forward to continuing this impactful work together.

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

Our counting book, also known as **Beans 123**, was translated into 16 additional languages in 2024, bringing the total number of languages to 66!



In our continued efforts towards diversifying our donor base we received grants from an additional two new foundations in 2024.




